- ¹⁴ And he sent out his arrows, and scattered them; he flashed forth lightnings, and routed them.
- Then the channels of the sea were seen, and the foundations of the world were laid bare at your rebuke, O LORD, at the blast of the breath of your nostrils.
- ¹⁶ He reached down from on high, he took me; he drew me out of mighty waters.
- ¹⁷ He delivered me from my strong enemy, and from those who hated me;

for they were too mighty for me.

- ¹⁸ They confronted me in the day of my calamity; but the LORD was my support.
- ¹⁹ He brought me out into a broad place; he delivered me, because he delighted in me.
- ²⁰ The LORD rewarded me according to my righteousness; according to the cleanness of my hands he recompensed me.

* 1st READING: Romans 9:19-33 CEB

¹⁹ So you are going to say to me, "Then why does he still blame people? Who has ever resisted his will?" ²⁰ You are only a human being. Who do you think you are to talk

back to God? Does the clay say to the potter, "Why did you make me like this?" ²¹ Doesn't the potter have the power over the clay to make one pot for special purposes and another for garbage from the same lump of clay? ²² What if God very patiently puts up with pots made for wrath that were designed for destruction, because he wanted to show his wrath and to make his power known? ²³ What if he did this to make the wealth of his glory known toward pots made for mercy, which he prepared in advance for glory? ²⁴ We are the ones God has called. We don't come only from the Jews but we also come from the Gentiles. ²⁵ As it says also in Hosea,

I will call "my people" those who aren't my people, and the one who isn't well loved. I will call "loved one."

- ²⁶ And in the place where it was said to them,
- "You aren't my people,"
 there they will be called "the living God's children.
- ²⁷ But Isaiah cries out for Israel,

Though the number of Israel's children will be like the sand of the sea,

only a remaining part will be saved,

because the Lord does what he says completely and quickly.

²⁹ As Isaiah prophesied,

If the Lord of the heavenly forces had not left descendants for us,

we would have been like Sodom, and we would have become like Gomorrah.

³⁰ So what are we going to say? Gentiles who weren't striving for righteousness achieved righteousness, the righteousness that comes from faith. ³¹ But though Israel was striving for a Law of righteousness, they didn't arrive. ³² Why? It's because they didn't go for it by faith but they went for it as if it could be reached by doing something. They have tripped over a stumbling block. ³³ As it is written:

Look! I'm putting a stumbling block in Zion, which is a rock that offends people.

And the one who has faith in him will not be put to shame.[f]

Holy wisdom, holy word.

* 2nd READING: Matthew 24:1-14 CEB

Now Jesus left the temple and was going away. His disciples came to point out to him the temple buildings. ² He responded, "Do you see all these things? I assure that no stone will be left on another. Everything will be demolished."

³ Now while Jesus was sitting on the Mount of Olives, the disciples came to him privately and said, "Tell us, when will these things happen? What will be the sign of your coming and the end of the age?"

⁴ Jesus replied, "Watch out that no one deceives you.

⁵ Many will come in my name, saying, 'I'm the Christ.' They will deceive many people. ⁶ You will hear about wars and reports of wars. Don't be alarmed. These things must happen, but this isn't the end yet. ⁷ Nations and kingdoms will fight against each other, and there will be famines and earthquakes in all sorts of places. ⁸ But all these things are just the beginning of the sufferings associated with the end. ⁹ They will arrest you, abuse you, and they will kill you. All nations will hate you on account of my name. ¹⁰ At

that time many will fall away. They will betray each other and hate each other. ¹¹ Many false prophets will appear and deceive many people. ¹² Because disobedience will expand, the love of many will grow cold. ¹³ But the one who endures to the end will be delivered. ¹⁴ This gospel of the kingdom will be proclaimed throughout the world as a testimony to all the nations. Then the end will come.
