- <sup>2</sup> Who can utter the mighty doings of the LORD, or declare all his praise?
- <sup>3</sup> Happy are those who observe justice, who do righteousness at all times.
- <sup>4</sup> Remember me, O LORD, when you show favor to your people;

help me when you deliver them;

- 5 that I may see the prosperity of your chosen ones, that I may rejoice in the gladness of your nation, that I may glory in your heritage.
- <sup>6</sup> Both we and our ancestors have sinned; we have committed iniquity, have done wickedly.
- <sup>7</sup> Our ancestors, when they were in Egypt, did not consider your wonderful works;
- they did not remember the abundance of your steadfast love, but rebelled against the Most High at the Red Sea.
- 8 Yet he saved them for his name's sake, so that he might make known his mighty power.
- <sup>9</sup> He rebuked the Red Sea, and it became dry; he led them through the deep as through a desert.

- <sup>10</sup> So he saved them from the hand of the foe, and delivered them from the hand of the enemy.
- <sup>11</sup> The waters covered their adversaries; not one of them was left.
- <sup>12</sup> Then they believed his words; they sang his praise.
- <sup>13</sup> But they soon forgot his works; they did not wait for his counsel.
- <sup>14</sup> But they had a wanton craving in the wilderness, and put God to the test in the desert:
- <sup>15</sup> he gave them what they asked, but sent a wasting disease among them.
- <sup>16</sup> They were jealous of Moses in the camp, and of Aaron, the holy one of the LORD.
- <sup>17</sup> The earth opened and swallowed up Dathan, and covered the faction of Abiram.
- <sup>18</sup> Fire also broke out in their company; the flame burned up the wicked.
- Glory to you, O Trinity, most <u>holy</u> and *blessed*, one God, now and for-<u>ever</u>, A-*men*.

## \* SILENCE FOR REFLECTION

## \* 1ST READING: Acts 7:44-8:1 CEV

The tent where our ancestors worshiped God was with them in the desert. This was the same tent that God had commanded Moses to make. And it was made like the model that Moses had seen. <sup>45</sup> Later it was given to our ancestors, and they took it with them when they went with Joshua. They carried the tent along as they took over the land from those people that God had chased out for them. Our ancestors used this tent until the time of King David. <sup>46</sup> He pleased God and asked him if he could build a house of worship for the people of Israel. <sup>47</sup> And it was finally King Solomon who built a house for God.

<sup>48</sup> But the Most High God doesn't live in houses made by humans. It is just as the prophet said, when he spoke for the Lord,

<sup>49</sup> "Heaven is my throne,

and the earth

is my footstool.

What kind of house

will you build for me?

In what place will I rest?

- <sup>50</sup> I have made everything."
- <sup>51</sup> You stubborn and hardheaded people! You are always fighting against the Holy Spirit, just as your ancestors did.

<sup>52</sup> Is there one prophet that your ancestors didn't mistreat? They killed the prophets who told about the coming of the One Who Obeys God. And now you have turned against him and killed him. <sup>53</sup> Angels gave you God's Law, but you still don't obey it.

<sup>54</sup> When the council members heard Stephen's speech, they were angry and furious. <sup>55</sup> But Stephen was filled with the Holy Spirit. He looked toward heaven, where he saw our glorious God and Jesus standing at his right side. <sup>56</sup> Then Stephen said, "I see heaven open and the Son of Man standing at the right side of God!"

<sup>57</sup> The council members shouted and covered their ears. At once they all attacked Stephen <sup>58</sup> and dragged him out of the city. Then they started throwing stones at him. The men who had brought charges against him put their coats at the feet of a young man named Saul.

<sup>59</sup> As Stephen was being stoned to death, he called out, "Lord Jesus, please welcome me!" <sup>60</sup> He knelt down and shouted, "Lord, don't blame them for what they have done." Then he died.

8 <sup>1-2</sup> Saul approved the stoning of Stephen. Some faithful followers of the Lord buried Stephen and mourned very much for him.

At that time the church in Jerusalem suffered terribly. All of the Lord's followers, except the apostles, were scattered everywhere in Judea and Samaria.

\* GOSPEL READING: John 5:19-29 CEV

<sup>19</sup> Jesus told the people:

I tell you for certain the Son cannot do anything on his own. He can do only what he sees the Father doing, and he does exactly what he sees the Father do. <sup>20</sup> The Father loves the Son and has shown him everything he does. The Father will show him even greater things, and you will be amazed. <sup>21</sup> Just as the Father raises the dead and gives life, so the Son gives life to anyone he wants to.

<sup>22</sup> The Father doesn't judge anyone, but he has made his Son the judge of everyone. <sup>23</sup> The Father wants all people to honor the Son as much as they honor him. When anyone refuses to honor the Son, this is the same as refusing to honor the Father who sent him. <sup>24</sup> I tell you for certain that

everyone who hears my message and has faith in the one who sent me has eternal life and will never be condemned. They have already gone from death to life.

<sup>25</sup> I tell you for certain the time will come, and it is already here, when all of the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God. And those who listen to it will live! <sup>26</sup> The Father has the power to give life, and he has given that same power to the Son. <sup>27</sup> And he has given his Son the right to judge everyone, because he is the Son of Man.

<sup>28</sup> Don't be surprised! The time will come when all of the dead will hear the voice of the Son of Man, <sup>29</sup> and they will come out of their graves. Everyone who has done good things will rise to life, but everyone who has done evil things will rise and be condemned.
